

What is a doula?

A woman supporting women and couples during pregnancy, childbirth, and postpartum.

A doula supports a pregnant woman and her family. A doula listens to a woman's needs and wishes, supports her in her choices and provides her with information so that she can take her own decisions.

It is a **on going support** throughout pregnancy, childbirth and the process of becoming a parent.

Doulas have helped improve parenting, decreased the need for medical interventions on the mother and her baby, reduced complications, and increased the chances of a positive experience of motherhood.

According to the information and resource service for midwives in Great-Britain (MIDIRS), "A constant female presence, supporting the woman throughout childbirth, is one of the most efficient ways to take care of a woman in labour, introduced in the last 25 years".

We are not midwives. Our role is not a medical one. We support the mother within the medical care model she has chosen, regardless of race, religion, or sexual preference. Our work relationship with the parents is based on confidentiality and mutual respect.

We support midwives and their work.
